1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

College is affiliated to the University of Mumbai, hence follows the syllabus prescribed by the University of Mumbai. During the academic year 2014-15, syllabus was revised for BCOM, BMS and BSC classes.

TYBCOM

Modification of syllabus has taken place in three courses - Export Marketing, Marketing Research, and Marketing & Human Resource Management

- ➤ In Export Marketing course, a topic on logistics and use of internet has been introduced to make the syllabus more in line with recent trends. The formats of commercial documents related to Export have been introduced to make the course more scoring.
- In Marketing & Human Resource Management course the latest trends in Marketing and Human Resource Management have been included to make the syllabus more in line with recent trends and there is moderate restructuring of the modules to give it a more logical flow.
- ➤ In Marketing Research course, latest concepts and fields of Marketing Research have been included in each module.

FYBMS

There were minor modifications in the syllabus of FYBMS (Semester I & Semester II) in the academic year 2014-15 in all the courses.

Modifications were made as per the changing trends in the subjects. New concepts were incorporated to equip students with practical skills and to enhance employability.

To name a few, in Principles of Management (POM) course planning, organizing, directing, staffing and controlling was added; in Introduction of Final Accounts, Vertical B/S and Accounting standard were added.

FYBSC

Chemistry

New topics are included in the revised FYBSC syllabi so as to build a proper understanding of the subject in a systematic and sequential order as they progress from FY to TY class.

Analytical chemistry is included in the Paper I for the first time to provide basic knowledge of the instrumentation dealing with the concepts of qualitative and quantitative measurements, interpretations of the results and an overview of the applications of various methods of analysis. This helps students in better understanding of the subject so as to meet the challenges in industry and academic field. Topic on '**Recent trends in Chemistry'** is included which gives an orientation towards many facets of research and aims to inculcate interest in research among students. The topic focuses mainly on Premier Research Institutes, Awardees in the research field and various Chemistry Journals and latest avenues in research.

Mathematics

The revised syllabi of FYBSC have a two semester course in Calculus (Analysis in 1st semester and calculus in 2nd semester) and Algebra (Basic algebra in 1st semester and Linear algebra in 2nd semester).

Everywhere in nature and technology one meets motions and processes which are characterized by functions. Hence the importance of study of functions and their inherent properties like limits continuity differentiability which has been included in the paper of Calculus.

Apart from including basic concepts of sets, relations, functions, induction hypothesis and study of integers a course in linear algebra has been included in Paper II in second semester. Linear algebra is basically study of linear equations and is vital in multiple areas of science. As practically every area of modern science contains models where equations are approximated by linear equation and solving the system helps to develop the theory.

1.5 Any new Department/Centre introduced during the year. If yes, give details.

Yes, Research Centre in Botany started.

Research Centre in Botany was set up and University of Mumbai after LIC visited & submitted its report granted permission for the five students to be registered for doctoral research in the centre. The process to register students under the guideship of Dr. Sunita Chahar has begun and the interview for selection of candidates is in process. Dr. Sunita Chahar is also working on one minor research project sanctioned by UGC, in the centre.
